I believe that the Seventh-day Adventists who understand and hold to that system of doctrine are not Christians, and that we, as Christians, should not extend the hand of fellowship to them. I believe that the Seventh-day Adventists who do not understand that system of doctrine, and who are trusting in the finished work of Christ alone for their salvation are Christians. I believe that these Seventh-day Adventists need to be enlightened concerning that system of doctrine, shown where it is contrary to the Word of God, urged to withdraw from the Seventh-day Adventist denomination, and encouraged to unite with a fundamental church.

I highly recommend this view of Seventh-day Adventism, for I am convinced on the basis of this study that this is the only view of Seventh-day Adventism which is defensible. It is my sincere prayer, therefore, that Christians will adopt it.

For the Seventh-day Adventists who understand and hold to the system of doctrine taught by the Seventh-day Adventist denomination, I pray that they will see the errors of that system of doctrine, and that they will trust in the finished work of Christ alone for their salvation, and be saved.
