

- (a) The Pope appointed Leon Joseph Cardinal Suenens of Belgium to encourage the growth of the charismatic movement in the Roman church. This was done because a growing number of highly favored ecclesiastics and theologians within the Roman Church believed that the charismatic renewal was bringing life to their ailing ecclesiastical body.

Note: The Pope made this appointment sometime prior to March, 1976 when Russell T. Hitt wrote his article entitled "A Second Look at the New Pentecostalism" in Eternity magazine.

- (b) The Charismatic Renewal Service Committee was formed with Father Kevin M. Ranaghan serving as chief executive officer and Bishop Joseph McKinney of Grand Rapids as episcopal advisor.
- (c) The Word of God Community began in Ann Arbor, Michigan. More than half of this community came from Protestant backgrounds. The Word of God Community was more technically known as Charismatic Renewal Services, Inc. It published quantities of literature as well as the monthly magazine, New Covenant which was sent to charismatic groups that had sprung up within the Roman Church.
