3. Dominion of David's Lord vs. 2

- a. Extent of the dominion
It will be universal vs. 2a cf. Psa. 2:8 and Zech. 9:10
- b. Commandment to have dominion vs. 2b

David's Lord will be commanded by the LORD (Jehovah) to have dominion over all his enemies

Note: The prediction of this commandment is given through David.

4. Subjects of David's Lord vs. 3.

- a. They will be completely dedicated to Him vs. 3a

Note: (1) the word "willing" means "free-will offerings." This means that the people of David's Lord will be completely dedicated to Him when He exerts His power and extends his Kingdom from Zion to the extreme limits of the earth. This fits with vs. 2 which says that the LORD (Jehovah) will extend the kingdom of David's Lord from Zion to the extreme limits of the earth, for what the Lord (Jehovah) does for David's Lord, He does through Him.

(2) The fulfillment of this prediction will occur at the second coming of Christ cf. Rev. 19:14 which says that "the armies that were in heaven followed him upon white horses, clothed in fine linen, white and clean."

- b. They will be holy vs. 3b

The fulfillment of this prediction will occur at the second coming of Christ cf. Rev. 19:14 which says that the armies that were in heaven were "clothed in fine linen, white and clean." According to Rev. 19:8 the "fine linen, white and clean" represents the righteousness of the saints.

- c. They will be innumerable vs. 3c cf. 2 Sam. 17:12 for the imagery of the dew
