

the profit out of the second year as I did the first, the reason being that they had the first to build on. You learn the language, then you use the languages in interpreting passages of Scripture, you use the language in studying your theology, in learning what God has taught on various matters, you use what you learn in the first year and the result is that you seem to get twice the value out of the second year as you did out of the first. ~~And~~ then I have heard many people say I got as much out of the third year as the first two put together. Because it is cumulative and you are going on, you are building. Every year I have people come to me and say I want to go to the mission field next year. Let me take one year at the seminary, just let me take the high spots in your course. Well, you can't get the high spots in the course in ~~the~~ one year. You have to get the foundation or you don't get what is built on the foundation. So our course is a course, an integrated course of three years, with its foundation laid on the study of the Hebrew and the Greek, and then going on to the application of these things to the Scriptures.

Now we believe that we should be good, but we believe that we should be good for something. We believe that we should be <sup>?</sup> sound, but we don't believe that we should be all <sup>?</sup> sound. We believe that we should be able to accomplish for the Lord. I talked with a young Jewish fellow ~~here~~ a few years ago and he said my how wonderful it must be to be in a theological seminary, where everybody is good, everybody is there because they want to do good in the world, it must be wonderful to ~~live in a place~~ <sup>be with people</sup> like that. But of course, he said, you'd never think of flunking anybody in a place like that. I said, we not only think of it, ~~but~~ we do. Because, I said, we are not interested in being good, but being good for something. And we expect our students to get down to solid work in order to get something that they can build on.
