

to become a minister and get a training that will enable to go forward and were sent thus to Princeton to get a training to carry on a profession which their fathers were in. I don't know whether in many cases their fathers were true Christians. In many cases they may have been really professional ministers. But I would say that a full third of the students when I was there were there simply for training for a profession for a good ~~job~~ job, and had no belief that effected their lives. And so we had a third of the students who were rushing off to dances and ~~theatricals~~ theatricals in other towns, engaging in a certain amount of drinking in their rooms, and there was a lot of that sort of thing going ~~on~~ on on the part of perhaps a third of the students when I was there. Of course that effected the spiritual life. Then, the professors when I was there were most of them very cold in their general attitude. They were great scholars and they were so tight to those books that they didn't pay much attention to the men. They would give the ~~st~~ studies. I think three-fourths of the teachers when I was there would stand up and give lectures and the few that were interested sat in the front row where you get it, and if you were back, if you listened real carefully you would get some of it; but they didn't seem to know anything about teaching or to care about teaching. There was a student there named Maclay. They sat us alphabetically and he and I sat next to each other and would the professors when ~~they~~ they would call on us. We didn't know whether he said Maclay or MacRae, and neither one of us would get up and we stood the same level in the class, so we didn't care much which one did the reciting and which one got the mark. They only called on you about once a semester anyway. But there was that sort of a coldness of an attitude and that, of course, effected the students. Now I think the majority of the professors then were real Christians and had a really devotional attitude in their hearts, but didn't put themselves out to try to have a personal influence on the students. Of course, they had a great many students (they had 250 students at that time). And it's very easy when you

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
