## Dr. MacRae Interviewed by Bim Neher

You have two questions. The first relates to a statement of Schaeffer that it is absolutely necessary to have discipline with regard to those who depart from thehistoric Christian faith, that we must stand for the holiness ofGod. But he goes on to say the Christian must show forth the love of God to those with whom he differs. Thirty-five years age in the Presbyterian crisis in the U.S. we forgot that. We did not speak with love about we those with whom we differ and we've been paying a high price for it ever since. We must love men including the existential theologian and we must visibly love them as people when we speak and write about them, and show it before the church and the world."

In contrast --- I would say that was taken by a lot who were trying to destroy the faith. Then there were those real Christians who were influenced by that, and who were more interested in whether you have a loving attitude than whether you stand for the truth. Then among those who stand for the truth, there is a natural thedency to react from that and I believe I never reacted from it and I am quite sure that there were many who did not, but there were certainly some who did. It reminds me of my first year at Westminster when I was asked to give a ordination sermon in
