It showed the tremendous ability of the man.

He was considered a Baptist preacher. I heard rumours that at one time he'd been a student at Moody Bible Institute. I don't know whether there is any truth to that or not, but I have heard a rumour that he went out with street teams and people threw stones at them and they stood up ^{he} and preached the Gospel very nobly in those days. I also heard once that he had gone to china to speak to the missionaries who had gone over, and he had said "I want to show you that a man can you will object to nothing that I have said--histalks completely pulled the wool over their eyes. Whether that's true or not, I don;t know. That was indirect. I do know as I mentioned to you once before, I read his book on the Manhood of the Master which was Scri ture passages and little lessons about them; very nice little devotional thing but it was all about the human characteristics of Christ, and there was not a suggestion of the deity. When I mentioned it to one of the fine leaders in BIOLA he said to me in that book, ~~he's~~ he's dealing with the humanity of Christ! Probably he'll write another one on His deity! Everyone was ready to give him the benefit of every doubt.
