

listen very closely to Dr. Machen pray so I'll know the right form to use and so I'll not pray in a way that's wrong; we must always pray to the Father, we must never address Christ. Dr. Machen always addresses the Father. Well, the next time I prayed publicly there I addressed Christ because I certainly believe we have a right to address Christ or the Holy Spirit--any member of the trinity, or the trinity as a whole. That attitude that developed is almost a cult! That is the attitude that characterizes so many of their students. Steve Christian lent me a brochure given him by a fellow who had signed up to come here but went to Westminster. It is a statement by one of their graduates which is comparatively recently about their history of how they came in, of them as compared with other groups. He says things about me that are completely false. He --It says, I was unwilling to stay in the school that was not solidly premil. Which is the exact opposite. I did not like the idea that while claiming not to take any stand on it, they were attacking premillennialism and leading people away from it. Absolutely different! The bitter spirit a lot of these graduates show, I cannot help feeling is inculcated in them by the faculty. But the faculty members I knew when I was there would never show it themselves. They have always been most gracious to me, and the faculty members there have never as far as I know published anything about me that I would consider showed that kind of spirit.

I told you how Dr. Kuiper's son in law got out this paper they called the Student's Viewpoint which completely attacked everything I said, and some of their graduates have attacked me in ways like that. So I feel it is this attitude of knowing the answer on every problem and insisting we've got it, it inculcates.
