We were in Wilmington, 30 mi. away, and of course that meant we weren't under his thumb nearly as much as we would have been if we'd been there, and of course they were put out of the building shortly after

All but 6 of the church had voted that the church should remain in the denomination, and drop the minister. The rest --the other 1500 or whatever it was-- had voted to go out and leave the church, but the courts gave the building to the six. So they met in a tent for a few years and then built a church.

But in those two cases, the Lord providentially gave me freedom to have innovations which I think no doubt in a way -- which I think worked out in a way that accomplished what I could not have accomplished otherwise.
