Seems to me he was from Cornell and he had a brother who went to Princeton (or maybe it was the other way around.) Anyway he was Art Glasser who now teaches at Fuller. He came to end the second year.

Another man who entered the second year was Kenneth Kantzer. During the first year we had correspondence with him. Dr. Harris was registrar. He had a long correspondence with Kantzer before he came which impressed Kantzer very much. He was with us four years. Three years undergraduate, and took one graduate. Very fine student and very fine man.

That first year I worked very very hard. Taught many hours and there were ==I mentioned the meetings I had with students, and there were many matters to work out, and then there were some problems with the Directors on various points on which we did not seem to see quite eye to eye. At the end of that first year I was very tired, and though I got considerable rest in the summer, I started the second year very tired.

The second year started with Dr. Harris having I believe it was a hernia operation. I may be wrong on that but that's my impression. At any rate he was laid up the first week of school, so for a couple of weeks I taught his course in beginning Hebrew in addition to my own courses. His other courses he took up I think the second semester, but I had that. I had a heavy load myself anyhow.

The second year I was tired all that year. It was kind of struggling to go forward. But we had a good year, a fine class. F. Schaeffer had graduated and taken a church in Grove City, and did a masterly work there. He worked terribly hard. He built a new church and I went and preached the dedication. He went from there to Chester to be Dr. Latham's assistant. From there he went to St. Louis. I went to St. Louis and preached his installation service there. He and I had great fellowship during those years.

Classes went along nicely. I lectured a great deal. I enjoyed it much. Particularly answering questions. I'm not sure whether we met one year or two years in the S.S. rooms of Dr. Laird's church. Then (I mentioned to you already) how they bought that fine house which was just a block from where I was living. We had most of our classes there. We had chapel in the church which was 3 or 4 blocks from there.

We --I'm not sure whether it was the 2nd or 3rd yr. we got that. Also at that time I was spending a good bit of time in the summers at the U. of Chicago working on the publication of my thesis; working with Dr. Curtis and Dr. Gelb there. I did that practically every summer for some time. I remember when they wrote and wanted me to come back for the meeting of == the first meeting of the B.P. Synod. It was called originally B.P. Synod.
