It is a very interesting question and I don't think the Scripture gives any definite evidence on which to be dogmatic on it, but if the Christians in this age when they accept Christ receive eternal life immediately and do not come into the judgment, I would incline to think that later ones also would not come into the great white throne judgment. I would incline to that but we don't have definite . Now I am not trying to prove to you the pre-tribulation rapture or the post-tribulation rapture by this point but I am trying to raise the question whether this point does not make a definite point looking in that direction, looking in the direction of an interval. Now perhaps that interval could be crowded into a few seconds or a few minutes but at least it would seem a little more natural for there to be a somewhat longer space of time than that and at least it would suggest that it isn't simply a manner of Christ coming and the righteous going up and joining Him and then He comes here on His white horse to put an end to wickedness as pictured in Revelation 19
