I heard a professor of ~~Church~~ Church History say once, that, if another epistle of the Apostle Paul were discovered, it would appear in the next edition of our Bibles. I do not believe that this is true. I do not think that it should be so. Paul may have written many epistles which we do not have; he may have ~~written~~ written many fine things, which, however, contained in them mixture of error. God did not intend them to be part of the Word of God, or He would have caused that they be gathered with the others. We have all those books which God caused Paul to write as part of the Word of God, which were inspired by the Holy Spirit, and intended ~~to~~ to be authoritative. Our Bible is complete; it is dependable; and it is trustworthy.
