

The answer must be, NO. There will be at least one more outpouring. Isa. 32:13-15 speaks of the desolation of the Holy Land "until the Spirit be poured out upon us from on high". Isa. 44:3 says, "I will pour out My Spirit upon thy seed." Zech. 12:10, "And I will pour upon the house of David, and upon the inhabitants of Jerusalem the Spirit of grace and of supplication; and they shall look unto Me whom they have pierced." Ezekiel 39:29, "Neither will I hide My face any more from thee; for I have poured out My Spirit upon the house of Israel, saith the Lord God."

~~In his commentary on the Acts, Mr. G. H. H. makes the point~~  
 that the Holy Spirit speaking through Peter never said that on that day the prophecy of Joel was fulfilled. His exact language is: "This is that which was spoken by the prophet Joel." And inasmuch as all these terrible portents in heaven and on earth connected with that outpouring did not occur at Pentecost, the language of the Holy Spirit is accurate to indicate that in the day of <sup>7</sup> ~~Pentecost~~ only a preliminary outpouring of the Holy Spirit occurred; so that the real fulfilment will be "afterward", the word which Joel uses, and then indeed this outpouring will far exceed in intensity and extent that on the day of Pentecost.

While then the Church is at <sup>7</sup> ~~present~~ enjoying the blessed presence of the Holy Spirit whose power occasionally breaks out in most gracious seasons of refreshing, the Old Testament repeatedly prophesies of a particular outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon all flesh. Of course, this will be upon Israel also, who will be endued with <sup>w</sup> ~~power~~ from on high for great things.

Having mentioned this blessed outcome the Prophet goes on giving us the circumstances of this in the third chapter, and how it all came about. "For behold, in that day and at that time when I shall bring back the captivity of Judah and Jerusalem, I will gather all
