We find in Romans 10:9-14 the statement of the Apostle as to what he felt was the Lord's will for him, and for many others. Ro. 10:9-15 he says, If thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved, for with the heart man believeth unto righteousness and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation, for the scripture saith, Whosoever believeth on him shall not be ashamed for there is no difference between the Jew and the Greek for the same Lord is over all is rich unto all that call upon Him, for whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved, How then shall they call upon Him, in whom they have not believed, and how shall they believe in him, of whom they have not heard and how shall they hear without a preacher. And over in I Cor. 9, the last part of the 16th verse, Paul said Woe is unto me if I preach not the gospel, and in verse 20-22 of that same I Cor. 9 he
