Truth is what's in your mind. Well of course it's utter nonsense. Some people say You can't get absolute certainty. You just have to presuppose it. You can't get it. Well that's nonsense. Is it raining outside or isn't it? There is no way as I stand here that I can get absolute certainty on it. It may be pouring rain outside. It may be bright and clear. But all I have to do is to step out doors and I immediately know that it is raining or isn't. There is absolute certainty there. In here it is a relative matter. I am uncertain. In here I have no way of knowing unless either I go and look or one of you go and look or one of you goes and looks and tells me. A revelation from one of you about it would give me absolute
