 Not as to the specific matter about the carrying on of the work of the Lord. It would seem to me that the work of the ministry could be thought of particularly under three heads. First, there might be the teaching. God gives the gift of teaching to some people and not to others. Certainly, there are many women who are excellent excellent teachers, some of them far better than most men. I do not feel that there is any scriptural reason why anyone/whom God has given the gift of teaching should ^{to} ~~refuse to exercise this gift, not to teach should not teach any who wish to receive teaching from them.~~

Second, it might be spoken of as preaching. Here we run into the fact that the word preach in use today is different from its scriptural use. In scripture it means to proclaim the good news. Now, it was God's plan that ~~x~~ everyone should proclaim the good news. There are certainly no restrictions as to who should do this.

In ~~x~~ modern usage the word preach has come quite largely to mean to try to exhort, to try to encourage people to do what is right, or to stand for what is ^{facts} ~~ture~~. You speak of how ~~or~~ you would not care simply to give ~~thanks~~ about missionary work without including in it any exhortation to the people or any attempt to win their hearts and arouse their interest. I certainly do not see ~~why you should feel that~~ why anyone ~~should~~ could ^{reasonably} possibly object to such exhortation. ~~Anyone~~ ~~It~~ is the duty of all Christians to righteousness, and a mere factual presentation ~~is~~ ^{is,} ~~if anything~~ is apt to be dull and ~~k~~ uninteresting if the ~~reaction~~ emotional reaction of the person giving it is not involved. I certainly would see no reason in the world you should not exhort in connection with your missionary message, and if someone wishes to call this preaching, ~~to see~~ I would say that they are using the word in *a sense different from that found in another than a scriptural sense.*
