You might as well say that if the KJV was good enough for St. Paul it is good enough for us! I have a little pamphlet about the textus receptus which Mr. Taylor just brought a bunch of in. I did not intend to bring them in until tomorrow, because I'm going to talk about that a bit tomorrow. If some of you want to take them today, I won't object though they are intended for tomorrow.
