

responsibility to help others to learn of Christ, to lead them to believe on Him. We all, whether in Christian work or not, have a great responsibility to help others in Christian ~~groth~~ growth. Then we have a responsibility which is sometimes forgotten, in fact often omitted, that is that it is our responsibility to look for His Son from heaven.

Now I mention this at this point because it is very much stressed as part of the will of God in a number of verses. 1 Thess. 1:9,10 speaks of the two things that were basic in the attitude of the Thess. Paul says that they themselves show of us what manner of entering in we had unto you, and how you turned to God from idols (and then he gives two purposes), to serve the living and true God, and to wait for His ^{SON} ~~SON~~ from heaven whom He ^{raised} ~~raised~~ from the dead even Jesus who delivered us from the wrath to come.

Occasionally you find a minister who preaches constantly on the Lord's coming. He never preaches on anything else. And some people get quite disgusted, and I believe it is a mistake. But for every minister who does that I think there are 8 or 10 who ~~andly~~ ever mention it, and it is an important subject which is entitled to a large measure of emphasis in the Christian ministry. or Paul would not have spoken of it this way.

In Titus 2:12-13 he says: For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men teaching us that denying ungodliness and worldly lusts we should live soberly, righteously and godly in this present age, looking for that blessed hope and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ." And in 2 Tim. 4:8 Paul says, Henceforth there is ~~is~~ laid up for me a crown of righteousness which the Lord the righteous
