God wants us to get our ideas of morality, our ideas of what is right and wrong from the Scripture.

Then we learn from Scripture about a few things about the nature of God. It is very easy for us to go on and build theories about these and let our imagination lead us off in one angle or another. The Bible tells us very clearly that Jesus Christ is God. It tells us very clearly that there is a difference between Jesus Christ and God the Father. We define that difference by saying there are three persons in the Godhead. But to understand that difference, to understand what we mean by that is beyond the ability of any of us. The Bible clearly teaches there is one God and not three Gods. Yet Jesus Christ is different from God the Father, yet there is one God who controls all things and who has established all things, who has determined all things, who has created all things. There is one God, and yet Jesus Christ is God and the Holy Spirit is God. We can't understand it, but we know it is true because Scripture tells us it is true. That is the only way that we
