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When we examine the anatomy we find that everything that comes into the right half of the right eye, goes to the left side of the brain. And everything that comes to the right side of the ~~the~~ left eye, also goes to the left side of the brain. But what goes into the left half of the left eye, and the left half of the right eye is carrying, transmitting messages to the right side of the brain. Where is your picture? What do you see?

It seems so obvious to us. We look, we see you. But actually by this marvellous mechanism the Lord has given us, the millions yes billions of small cells in our eyes gather impressions, put them together, shift them in this way so that you have half of each going to a different part of the head altogether. And from those two pictures over there each of which has a half of the picture in the two eyes, in some way we get the impression that we see it, we see the picture. It is a very complex sort of thing.

Seeing is believing, but seeing is a complicated process. This marvellous instrument God lends us for a few years on this earth. This human body. He enables us to use in order to get an idea of what is there in front of us. Actually as the Apostle says, we fix our eyes on what is seen, but that which is seen is only temporary, but that which is eternal has just as much evidence. There's just as much reality to it. There's just as much importance to it in our lives. In fact far more than what we actually see with out eyes. It's eternal.

So it's vital we take a day in which we try to take time to look at God, see His reality, His great power, to see His holiness, to see ~~the~~ how important a factor he should be in our lives. And we should be just as conscious of His presence and reality as we are of any other spirit, ~~&~~ of any human being.
