

for our emotional life. How easy it is for us to neglect that. Particularly if you have a man who has a wife and a family to support and he rushes from his job to the seminary, perhaps rushing off from classes to another job. His wife perhaps has a job at different hours than he has. How easy it is for them to fail to take the time to have the personal fellowship and the spiritual life he should have.

I heard of a large seminary not long ago where in one year they had 11 divorces. It is shameful that Christian people should not show to the world an example of family life, an example of love within the family such as there should be. It is necessary that we take time to have fellowship with members of our family, for the mutual spiritual stimulation God wants us to have individual individual private prayer, He also wants us to have mutual prayer together and to realize He wants our emotional needs to be satisfied. I think they can properly go ~~u~~ under our daily bread. All our needs we must look to God to help us find the satisfaction for.

The purposes of the seminary, as we think of them and the work it has accomplished in these years and of the tremendous opportunities before it in the future, as we think of that, we should on the day of prayer remember the daily bread for the seminary. We should remember that God owns the cattle on a thousand hills, His resources are infinite, and yet we are bound by financial difficulties in meeting the needs we have, in getting and doing the things we need to do because of financial needs. So on the day of prayer we should very properly remember the needs of the seminary.

Then I like to think on the day of prayer of students in college. I don't know whether its quite as bad, the uncertainty there was when I was a student---- when I first was teaching, but in those days students in college wanting to train for the Lord's service found it terribly hard to know where to go to seminary. I remember one student who came to seminary where I was to visit, he went to another seminary, he went to another and then he went to all three over again. He could not make up his mind. Actually your whole life is affected by the seminary you go to. It puts a stamp on you whether you want it to or not. You can't help it. You are affected by the institution where you study.

I knew of a man recently who went to a fine Christian seminary to study. He was such a fine student they urged him to go to Harvard and study theology there and get an advanced degree and come back and teach God's truth there. When he came out of there thinking he stood by the Word of God as thoroughly as he did when he went, but as I read a long paper he had ~~w~~ written. I saw how his mind had been affected by the teaching he got. It makes a tremendous difference in the average college student when he hears many voices and he just does not know what to do with his life, how he should prepare to serve God most effectively. So I wish on the day of prayer we would remember college students who are in some ways uncertain just what they should do. You may say it doesn't make any difference what they do in these matters but it can make a tremendous difference to your whole life. So let us pray that God will lead and direct
