

He described how in going thru Peru and people asked him, They said these people are the most peaceful people you can imagine. He said there is absolutely no danger from them. I had a friend who was a missionary in Peru a few years ago who went off into the jungles and started churches here and there. Did a very fine missionary work ~~and~~ reaching many many people there in Peru. There was a time when there was a small riot. The Christians were interfered with. ~~They were~~ in one of the towns there, and the Peruvian government immediately sent in an official to tell these people they must maintain peace and must not interfere with religious activities. Today things are quite different.

Throughout S. America there are individuals trying to stir people up, to stir up trouble, to make a change. I have a ~~letter~~ letter here ~~that~~ that tells about a missionary group in Peru where they were having in one of the towns that I visited years ago, that the people were having a worship service. A number of men burst into the churchsanctuary, with bayonets and machine guns. Six of the church leaders were selected from the assembled congregation and taken outside for questioning. Two of the armed men remained and ordered the congregation to sing hymns. After 15 min. they left and the worship and prayer continued. Expecting the selected leaders to be ddetained for a couple of hours for questioning about terrorist activities in the area, the congregation was horrified after the prayer meeting to find their bullet-ridden bodies about 25 feet from the church. Three of them had come to know the Lord through the ministry of our missionaries and had been baptized and were being disciplined by them. All of them were fine Christians, followers of Jesus Christ.

Missionaries in the hill country of Peru are having to leave there and go down to the capital city, because the Christians are begging them to leave them because their lives were in danger. Some of them are having their tongues taken out because of their relation to the missionaries. Some of them are having their eyes blotted out. We have similar situation in Nicaragua and in Central America.

But Mexico, you don't hear anything. In Mexico conditions are as bad as anywhere in the world. In Mexico the officials in the last few years have stolen millions of dollars and sent it off to banks in Switzerland, and those ~~who~~ who were officials 5 yrs. ago are living in wealth, in Europe today. The currency has been cut to a third of its value. But you don't hear about any of these things (going on) in Mexico. Why not? Because it is outsiders who are stirring up the trouble in Central America, and they are not ready yet for trouble in Mexico. Things are peaceful. There is no problem in Mexico. But Nicaragua has been taken over. All liberties have been taken away from the people there.

The attempt is being made now to take El Salvadore, and then you go north step by step and then you will have Mexico and you will have millions of innocent people fleeing in terror over the southern border of the U.S. There is a vicious situation there orchestrated from Moscow and from Cuba. There is a situation there that every American should be concerned about.
