5) standard type

✓ 1) make 2nd copy- Broad and Cherry St.- Xerox (microfilm included)

2) have initial page of instructions asking for neatness, noting that this is a scholarly work

3) reiteration is never enough; make sure there is no doubt. Write in margins of MS with different colored inks, etc.

4) It won't be necessary to send copies to be perused by all contributors; slows progress, and editorial unity all -important.
