It is obvious the prophet is speaking have figuratively. Such terms as harvest is sowing, and reaping are used a good many times in a figurative sense in Scripture. The full import may not always be apparent to a good many of us since comparatively few of us have a farming background. Yet there are teachings connected with this theme that I believe are extremely important and particularly important for seminary people.

I want to speak this morning about the harvest. There are two of these that are referred to in the NT° that are quite different from one another. The first of these we find mentioned in one of Jesus' parables when he said in Mat. 13:24-28a, "The kingdom of heaven is like a man who sowed good seed in his field, but while everyone was sleeping his enemy came and sowed tares among the wheat and went away. [Skip two spaces]

in John 4:34-36. Jesus said, My food is to do the will of Him who sent me and to finish His work. Do not say, Four months more and then the harvest. I tell you open your eyes and look at the field; They are ripe for harvest. Even now the reaper draws his wages. Even now he harvests the crop for eternal life. So that the sower and the reaper will be glad together. L believe we would all agree that Jesus here was referring to the harvest of souls That he was referring to the work of the Christian in reaping == reaching individuals for Christ, and in helping other Christians to grow in grace and in the knowledge of the Lord. Here there is a tremendous harvest to be obtained and Jesus said, The fields are ripe for harvest. STudents come to seminary in order to prepare to enage in the Lord's work, They however must not wait until after expect to accomplish something for Christ. We are here in the midst of an ungodly world. All, around we find And viduals who are on their destruction. God ca to look forward to look forward to Christian service to be done after we are fully trained. We hope that we will be far more effective and efficient than we are now, but it is important that we do Christian service right now. II have heard it said, An ocean voyage never made a missionary. A person who has not served the Lord effectively in this country is very unlikely to accomplish much for Him across the seas. The field is the world. Th e need is grat. God calls upon each of us to work for the harvest.

The reference to sowing and harvesting is used in a quite a different way in Gal. 6:7 where the apostle says, Be not deceived. God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. The man who sows to please his sinful nature from that mature will
