It was also called the Elohist narrative from its use of the name Elohim, but this title describes only the portion before Exodus 6 and (as well be shewn subsequently) is not a sufficiently distinctive title. By more recent critics it has been called . . .the Priestly code, . . .

Speiser, 154 Gen.21.2b Elohim is the normal designation of the Deity not only in E (vs. 6ff) but also in P, along with El Shaddai.
