CHAPTER 6.
1 The wickedness of the world. 2 Noah found grace. 3 The orders, form, and end of the ark.

AND it came to pass, when men began to multiply on the face of the earth, and daughters were born unto them,

2 That the sons of God saw the daughters of men that they were fair; and they took them wives of all which they chose.

3 Of every clean beast thou shalt take to thee by sevens, the male and his female; and of beasts that are not clean by two, the male and his female.

4 Of birds also of the air, by sevens, the male and the female; to come in unto him upon the face of the earth.

5 For yet seven days, and I will cause rain to fall upon the earth forty days and forty nights; and every living substance that is upon the earth, I will destroy from off the face of the earth.

6 And Noah did according unto all that the Lord commanded him.

7 And Noah went into the ark, he and his wife, and his sons, and his wife, and his sons' wives with him, because of the waters of the flood.

8 Of clean beasts, and of unclean that are not clean, and of birds, and of every thing that creepeth upon the earth.

9 There went in two and two unto Noah into the ark, the male and the female, as God had commanded Noah.
