

Anderson, G. W., p. 35 It is true that the E material is sometimes difficult to distinguish from J, and when it has been identified, often seems to consist of fragmentary variations of the J stories.

p. 36 The difference in style between E and J is a subtle one, and easier to sense than to describe or define.

Gray, G. B., p. 43 " . . . the analysis of the complex JE into the two elements J and E is itself often difficult and uncertain; . . .

Anderson, B. W., Understanding the O.T.

1957 ed., p. 53 Ex. 19.3-6 given to "probably J"

1966 ed., p. 58 same " - " "probably E"

Pfeiffer, p. 170 "In the stories that follow (Ex. 16-18), J and E cannot be separated." (However, Carpenter & Harford, Harford-Battersby, Brightman, Bewern Stalker, Harrelson, and others to a lesser degree, succeed in separating these sources)

Pfeiffer, p. 171 The J and E stories of the sending out of spies, supplemented with a P account, cannot be disentangled in Numbers 13f.
