

India: Same as Arabia.

China: First term, five years; furlough one year plus time of travel;
Subsequent terms:
Single people, six years; " " " " " " "
Married people, seven years;" " " " " " "

Korea, Japan, Palestine, Kenya, Mexico and Chile, same as China.

Peru: First term, four years; furlough one year, including time of travel;
Subsequent terms:
Single people, five years; " " " " " " "
Married people, six years; " " " " " " "

Bolivia: Same as Peru.

Special Causes of Return:

1. In case a missionary must return home prior to the regular furlough, other than for health reasons hereinafter provided for, it must be upon recommendation of the Mission to the Board. If the Board approves such leave of absence, the missionary has the option of having deducted from the next furlough period the time of absence less the period of annual vacation when this falls within the time of absence; or, the next term of service may begin on return to the field at the expiration of the leave of absence. All expenses of travel for such leave shall be borne by the missionary, who shall receive during such leave, field salary and other benefits as if actually upon the field.
2. In matters of health return is also provided for and a health certificate issued by a physician of this Board is all that is necessary. If no Independent Board physician is available the attending physician's certificate and the recommendation of the Mission is required. Health leave is to continue until restoration; or, if after a period of two years restoration is not effected, the Board will regretfully consider that missionary service must be discontinued. Should full restoration occur after the period of two years, appointment to active service may again be made. When returning on health leave the Board pays expenses as when returning on regular furlough.

Furlough Salary and Allowances:
