I do not what your situation is as regards the draft. Personally I believe that if a man is anxious to serve the Lord in the active ministry, he #ph will personally perform a greater service for his country by securing a full theological training, than he would per by adding one more soldier to the armed forces. The government evidently agrees with this, since it defers theological students and pre-theological students until

they in have completed their theological training.

If a pro-theological student 1/2 is to be deferred, it is necessary that the have evidence that he has already been accepted by a theological seminary. I do not consider this as meaning that it is necessary that one be absolutely certain that this is the seminary at which he wishes to train. I do consider it as meaning that he is sincerely determined that when he finishes college it is his / intention to go to a theological seminary. If a man gives evidence of this intention, and has the requirements necessary for entrance to Faith, /// on /// prevision, of course, on successful completion of his college nourse, we accept him provisionally as a student for a future year. Then we are ready to notify the draft board if and when they ask for information about him.

In your case, since you come from a Calvinistic background, the normal thing would be for you to go to a seminary holding the Presbyterian viewpoint, such as we hold. If you were to change your mind later and go to one of a different view, that would, of course, be up to you. However, under present circumstances, it would impress me as entirely right for you to make application to a Presbyterian-minded and seminary and been provisional acceptance.
