IV. Methods of Christian Education

- A. Lecture--covers large amount of material. Used usually in large classes
 1. Helps
 - a. Pictures, charts, maps, stories (illustrations)--gives truth hands and feet--conveys joy, sorrow, humor. See the Bible. Not an academic Book, a Book of Life and living (Dt. 32:46,47); overhead, film strips, flannelgraph, and artifacts.
 2. Advantages:
 - a. Makes possible the effectiveness of the spoken word. Gives more color than the printed page. Alive!
 - b. Makes possible more effectual operation of the personality of teacher.
 - c. Arouses interest and motivates pupil. More effective appeal to emotions.
