

the genetic material (chromosomes and genes) of the fossils is never preserved, so there is usually no way of settling the arguments of past relationships of organisms. In other words, the disagreement is in an area where scientific evidence is lacking, but with human nature what it is, speculations still abound.

If an attempt is made to reject this principle on the ground that the production of sugar in corn is known only because of the work of man, rather than being written in the Bible, we should recall the fact that even our knowledge of the Israelites and of the disciples depends on human ability to correctly read human language.
