The content and nature of local stratigraphic columns are frequently shown in this manner in geologic publications. Note the depths in feet given in small numerals along the left side of each column. (The upper 1,500 feet of each column was omitted in the original publication.) Only the middle part of each column has been reproduced in this figure.
