This is a magnified view of calcium carbonate crystals of cement, together with several peloids (or pellets) which have been cemented together by the crystals. The cement crystals are the white, angular blocks; the peloids are the large dark masses. A considerable proportion of the limestone deposits of the world show this type of texture.
